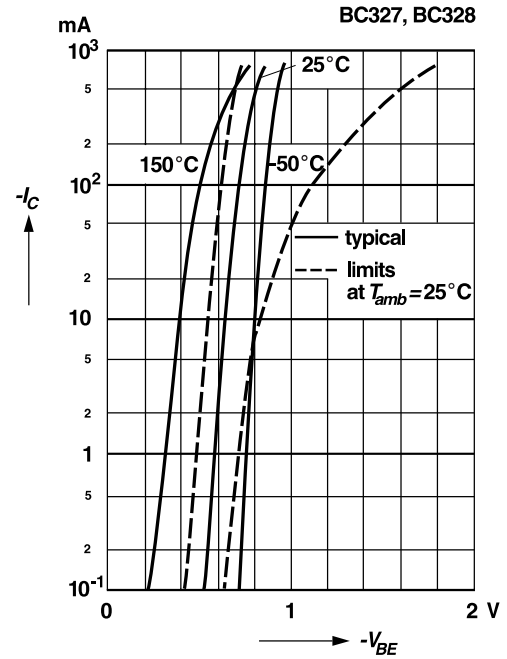

Valid provided that leads are kept at ambient temperature at a distance of 2 mm from case

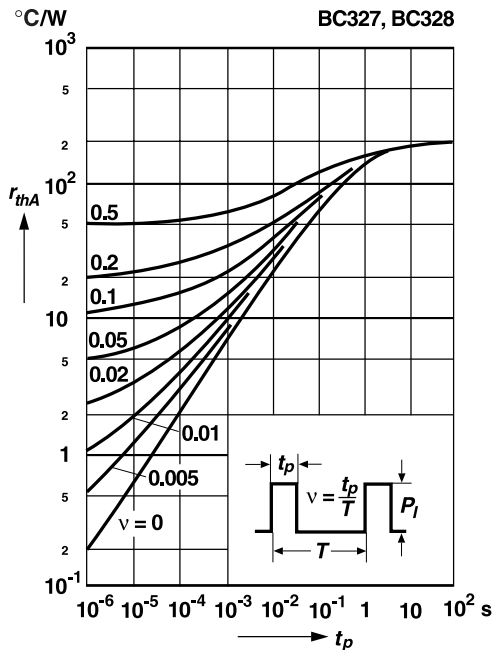


**Collector current versus base-emitter voltage**

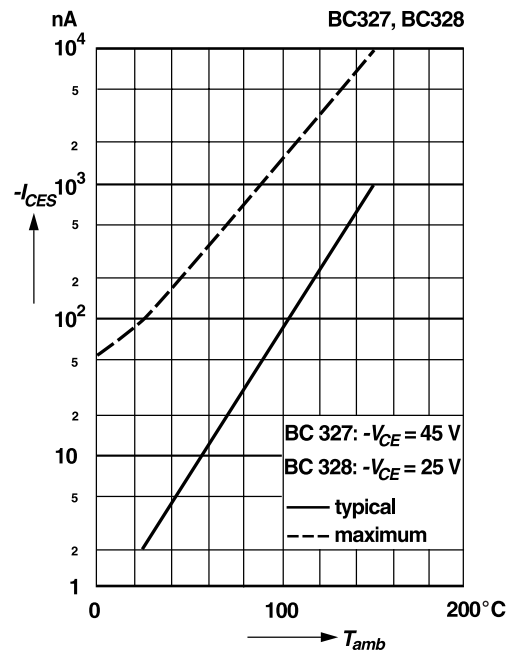


**Pulse thermal resistance versus pulse duration**

**Collector-emitter cutoff current versus ambient temperature**



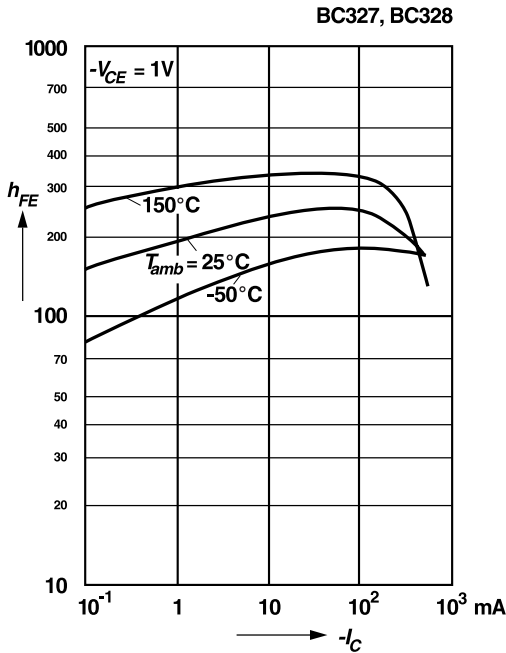

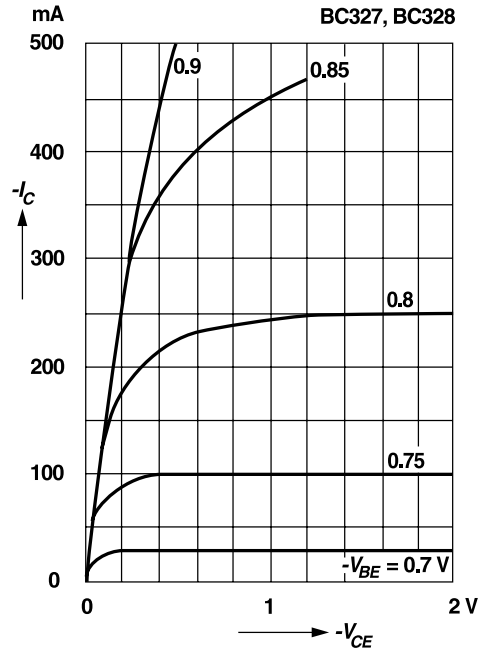

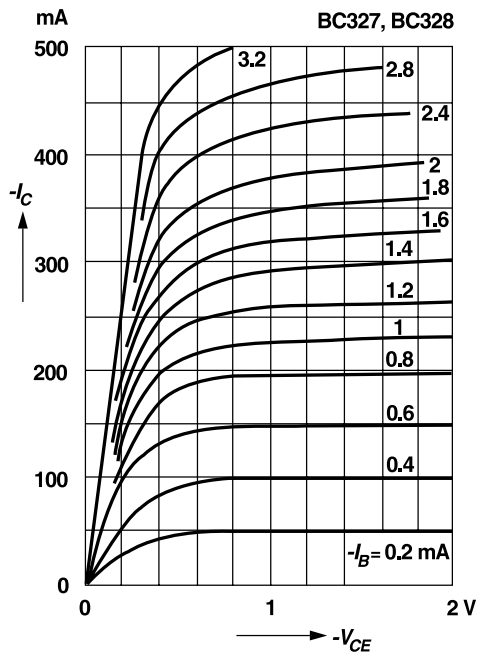
DC current gain  
versus collector current



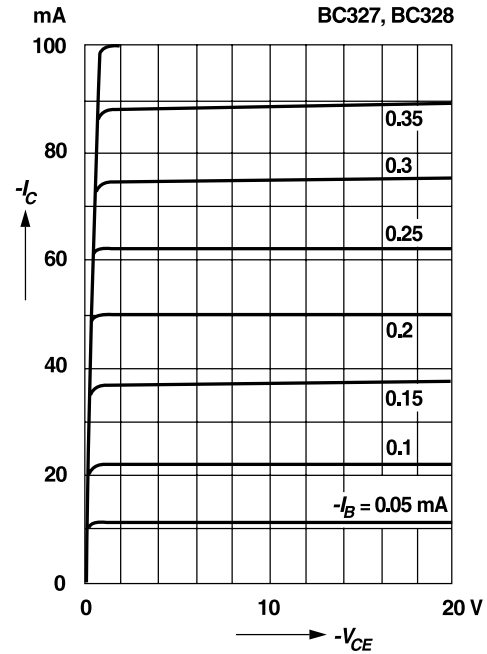
Common emitter

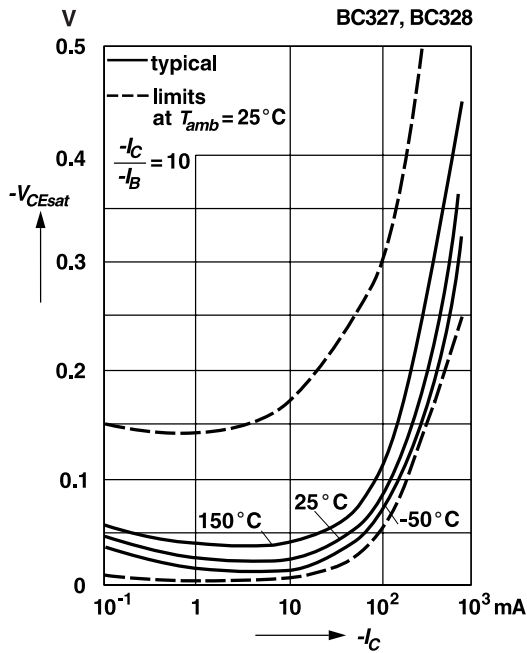

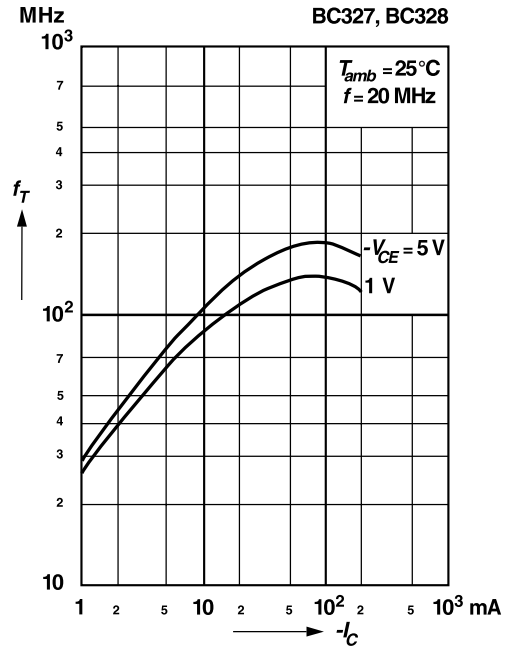
